Shrove Tuesday!

On Tuesday February 13, the students will be participating in Shrove Tuesday. We will have members of council preparing the pancakes on the premises in the servery. They will be using a nut free pre-made pancake mix from Aunt Jemima. The ingredients are as follows: Wheat flour, corn flour, sugar, modified milk ingredients, monocalcium phosphate, dextrose, sodium bicarbonate, salt, wheat gluten, glucose solids, modified corn starch, and colour. They will also be using the Aunt Jemima syrup. The Ingredients are as follows: Glucose, glucose-fructose, water, cellulose gum, natural and artificial flavor, salt, caramel color, sodium benzoate, sodium hexametaphososphate, sorbic acid, sulphites. Registration for the 2018-2019 school year begins January 8, 2018

To register, please bring the following original documents:

- Roman Catholic Baptismal Certificate (child or parent)
- Proof of age
- Proof of legal status in Canada
- Proof of residency
- Proof of Separate School Support (i.e. MPAC Assessment Notice), or you can complete a school support form that is included in the registration package.
- JK: Children must be 4 years old by Dec. 31, 2018 (born in 2014)
- **SK:** Children must be 5 years old by Dec. 31, 2018 (born in 2013)

If your child is already attending a YCDSB school for JK registration is not required.

Keeping EpiPens Up-to-date


As we continue to monitor EpiPen expiry dates and send home notices of expirations, please ensure that you send in an up-to-date EpiPen as soon as possible.
