#### **SCHOOL ORGANIZATION FOR SEPTEMBER 2018**

We are beginning to plan the school organization for September 2018. It would be appreciated that you advise the office if your family is planning to move out of the Father Frederick McGinn boundaries or change schools.

The process for formulation of class lists for September will begin soon. After we determine class organization, each student is individually discussed and placed according to a number of criteria. This is a process we take very seriously; it involves much prayer, thought and conversation.

Given the parameters in which we have to work as determined by registration numbers and ministry and board directives, our goal is to establish balanced classes, providing effective groups which will benefit all children. Teachers in sending grades meet to carefully consider learning styles, academic skills, social grouping, special education and ESL needs, behaviour needs, etc. You can surely appreciate that creating the best and most effective groupings is a task requiring careful thought and planning. Our goal is to establish balanced classes to provide effective working groups which will benefit all children in each class

At this time, we are uncertain as to which teachers will teach a specific grade. Staffing decisions will not be finalized until late August.

Accepting parental requests for specific teachers is not permitted under Board guidelines, and would not be in the best interest of all children in the school as it could restrict school staff in forming what we consider to be the most ideal classroom groupings.

The teachers who have worked with the children this year know them and will make determinations based on each child's best interests. If you feel strongly that there are extenuating circumstances not listed above, please submit your request in writing, including the rationale for your request, to Ms. Sullivan by Friday, May 18.

Any written requests will be shared with the team of teachers generating class lists, however, this does not guarantee that your request can be honoured.

- Proof of age
- Proof of legal status in Canada
- Proof of residency
- Proof of Separate School Support (i.e. MPAC Assessment Notice), or you can complete a school support form that is included in the registration package.

**JK:** Children must be 4 years old by Dec. 31, 2018 (born in 2014)

**SK:** Children must be 5 years old by Dec. 31, 2018 (born in 2013)

If your child is already attending a YCDSB school for JK registration is not required.

#### **FFM Safety Blitz**

#### **Student Drop-Off and Driveway**

Parents and guardians are reminded to exercise caution and be patient when using the student drop off and parking lot areas, especially during peak periods.

Here are a few simple rules:

- Do not park in the drop off loop (this impedes traffic and slows everyone down)
- Do not park in the handicap spot unless you have the appropriate sticker
- Have your child exit from the passenger side of your car
- If you would like to walk your child/children to the door, you need to park your car in the designated lot or spot on the street
- No cars should be entering the front parking lot between **8:45am-9:00am and 3:15 pm -3:45 pm** (Only school buses are permitted to enter during these times)
- Do not let your child out at the curve near the handicap parking, stopping there impedes traffic, pull up ahead to the curb so other parents can continue to pull up, let's keep the flow going
- If dropping child off by front lot, there is no stopping in front of or immediately adjacent to the driveway obey the signs that say NO stopping at any time
