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

MILKBAGSunlimited program - We need your milk bag's

Father Frederick McGinn CES is participating in the MILKBAGSunlimited program. Our Parish will supporting FFM school by collecting Milk Bags for them which will be used to help make beds for the homeless in Canada, Syrian refugees in Greece and other countries when natural disasters strike. And in doing so also reducing the garbage in our land-fills

The milk bags used are the ones that hold the three smaller bags of milk. The bags are cut into strips, tied together, and then woven or crocheted into mats. It takes approximately 400 milk bags to make one adult sized mat. A collection box is available in the church foyer for community drop-off and in the school foyer for school drop-off.

Registration for the 2018-2019 school year begins **January 8, 2018**


To register, please bring the following original documents:

- Roman Catholic Baptismal Certificate (child or parent)
- Proof of age
- Proof of legal status in Canada
- Proof of residency
- Proof of Separate School Support (i.e. MPAC Assessment Notice), or you can complete a school support form that is included in the registration package.

JK: Children must be 4 years old by Dec. 31, 2018 (born in 2014)

SK: Children must be 5 years old by Dec. 31, 2018 (born in 2013)

If your child is already attending a YCDSB school for JK registration is not required.



FFM Safety Blitz

Student Drop-Off and Driveway

Parents and guardians are reminded to exercise caution and be patient when using the student drop off and parking lot areas, especially during peak periods.

Here are a few simple rules:

- Do not park in the drop off loop (this impedes traffic and slows everyone down)
- Do not park in the handicap spot unless you have the appropriate sticker
- Have your child exit from the passenger side of your car
- If you would like to walk your child/children to the door, you need to park your car in the designated lot or spot on the street
- No cars should be entering the front parking lot between **8:45am-9:00am and 3:15 pm -3:45 pm** (Only school buses are permitted to enter during these times)
- Do not let your child out at the curve near the handicap parking, stopping there impedes traffic, pull up ahead to the curb so other parents can continue to pull up, let's keep the flow going
- If dropping child off by front lot, there is no stopping in front of or immediately adjacent to the driveway obey the signs that say NO stopping at any time
