SCHOOL ORGANIZATION FOR SEPTEMBER 2018

We are beginning to plan the school organization for September 2018. It would be appreciated that you advise the office if your family is planning to move out of the Father Frederick McGinn boundaries or change schools.

The process for formulation of class lists for September will begin soon. After we determine class organization, each student is individually discussed and placed according to a number of criteria. This is a process we take very seriously; it involves much prayer, thought and conversation.

Given the parameters in which we have to work as determined by registration numbers and ministry and board directives, our goal is to establish balanced classes, providing effective groups which will benefit all children. Teachers in sending grades meet to carefully consider learning styles, academic skills, social grouping, special education and ESL needs, behaviour needs, etc. You can surely appreciate that creating the best and most effective groupings is a task requiring careful thought and planning. Our goal is to establish balanced classes to provide effective working groups which will benefit all children in each class.

At this time, we are uncertain as to which teachers will teach a specific grade. Staffing decisions will not be finalized until late August.

Accepting parental requests for specific teachers is not permitted under Board guidelines, and would not be in the best interest of all children in the school as it could restrict school staff in forming what we consider to be the most ideal classroom groupings.

The teachers who have worked with the children this year know them and will make determinations based on each child's best interests. If you feel strongly that there are extenuating circumstances not listed above, please submit your request in writing, including the rationale for your request, to Ms. Sullivan by Friday, May 25

Any written requests will be shared with the team of teachers generating class lists, however, this does not guarantee that your request can be honoured.

Environmental Committee News

"The Earth is our environment to protect and the garden to tend to."

The eco-club have completed their waste minimization and energy conservation audit. FFM has improved in their energy conservation with a 95% success rate with lights out, 90% rate of electronics powered off, and 95% success rate with blinds and curtains closed when not needed and vents clear of obstructions.

The waste minimization has seen a reduction in contamination of garbage and recycling from 60% to 20%.

The school diversion rate is 27%. This means that waste is diverted from landfills 27% of the time.

FFM Eco-club is excited that we have ordered two water refill stations for our school and they should be installed in the near future. This will replace the water fountain and will allow students to refill their water bottle easily. Thank you to the Catholic School Council for supporting this.

On May 18th the Ontario Eco-school staff will be visiting FFM to check out our environmental initiatives. We have applied for Platinum status as an eco-school and should get our results in May.

Kindergarten Registration

Registration for the 2018-2019 school year begins **January 8, 2018**

To register, please bring the following original documents:

- Roman Catholic Baptismal Certificate (child or parent)
- Proof of age
- Proof of legal status in Canada
- Proof of residency
- Proof of Separate School Support (i.e. MPAC Assessment Notice), or you can complete a school support form that is included in the registration package.
- **JK:** Children must be 4 years old by Dec. 31, 2018 (born in 2014)
- **SK:** Children must be 5 years old by Dec. 31, 2018 (born in 2013)

If your child is already attending a YCDSB school for JK registration is not required.

Municipal Election 2018 Monday, October 22, 2018 Voting Information for Catholic Ratepayers

Protect and promote Catholic education...Ensure you are registered to vote as a Catholic separate school supporter

- Ensuring you are registered as a separate school supporter is important for the protection and preservation of Catholic education in Ontario.
- As a registered Catholic school supporter, you have the opportunity to elect trustees who will represent and address your interests and concerns at the school board level and at various levels of the government.
- Registering your Catholic school support ensures your school board's assessment roll is accurate. This is important because:
 - Your school board's assessment base is a public record of the breadth of support for Catholic schools
 - o It helps track demographic trends for educational planning purposes
 - o It guarantees your right to enroll your children in Catholic schools

How to check if you are registered:

- Visit <u>voterlookup.ca</u>, an online service created by the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) to check the accuracy of your voter information.
- Or call your Municipal Clerk's Office to inquire how to check the local list of electors.

If your name is not on the list of electors or if the information is incorrect (e.g., name, address or school support data missing or incorrect) you should:

- Update or change your information, add a name to an address, or change your school support directly on the <u>voterlookup.ca</u> website.
- Go to the municipal offices for your community and fill out an application to be added to the list or to correct information. Proof of identification may be required. Please call your municipal office to determine what documentation you may need.

At the Polling Station:

- Verify that you are registered as a separate school supporter. If your support status is incorrect ask for an 'Application to Amend Voters' List'. This form may be completed and submitted at the polling station.
- Ensure the ballot you are given is a separate school ballot.

Voting for Catholic School Board Representation:

 Catholic ratepayers must declare themselves to be Catholic <u>and</u> separate school electors in order to cast a vote in the election of separate school trustees in municipal elections.


Student Drop-Off and Driveway

Parents and guardians are reminded to exercise caution and be patient when using the student drop off and parking lot areas, especially during peak periods.

Here are a few simple rules:

Do not park in the drop off loop (this impedes traffic and slows everyone down)

Do not park in the handicap spot unless you have the appropriate sticker



If you would like to walk your child/children to the door, you need to park your car in the designated lot or spot on the street

We No cars should be entering the front parking lot between **8:45am-9:00am and 3:15 pm -3:45 pm** (Only school buses are permitted to enter during these times)

Do not let your child out at the curve near the handicap parking, stopping there impedes traffic, pull up ahead to the curb so other parents can continue to pull up, let's keep the flow going

If dropping child off by front lot, there is no stopping in front of or immediately adjacent to the driveway - obey the signs that say NO stopping at any time
